1 INTRODUCTION

Public participations are vital in any Municipality ac which is in accordance with the provision of Article 10 [2] [a] of the Constitution of Kenya read together with sections 6 [6], 87, 106 [4], and 115 [1] of the County Government Act 2012 and the Laikipia County Public Participation Act, 2014. That is why there is the need to have a structured approach in Nanyuki Municipality. Therefore, this framework aims at providing voice to the people through forums, surveys, as well as community meetings to realize a more effective governance system. Through promoting effective working relations between the municipal authorities and the society, it aims at improving the practicality, openness and the general efficiency of decision-making in Nanyuki Municipality.

2 WAYS OF ENGAGING THE PUBLIC IN NANYUKI MUNICIPALITY

Citizens' engagement within the Nanyuki Municipality often entail being inclusive, open, collaborative, and accountable. This consists of engaging the public through involvement, ensuring they understand the subject area, encouraging the free flow of information regarding the topic and ensuring that their ideas are incorporated in the decision-making. The purpose is to improve participation and openness in the society.

3 OBJECTIVES

- 1) Inclusivity: This helps in capturing the interests and welfare of all the community members, and contributes towards ensuring Nanyuki Municipality addresses these needs.
- 2) Transparency: This enables the local authorities to engage with the people with a view of sharing important information on certain policies, projects and general decisions that affect the public in order to ensure that they understand them.
- 3) Accountability: It ensures that government officials can be challenged and held responsible since residents have the ability to be engaged in assessing and shaping decisions concerning their community.
- 4) Enhanced Decision-making: This carries out a local consultation to ensure that decisions can only be made by coming up with relevant policies or projects that have been demanded by the community.
- 5) Community empowerment : This allows people to engage in various activities that enhance the development of their municipality, making it easier for them to own and be full participants in developmental programs.
- 6) Conflict resolution : This allows easing of tensions and development of a clearer channel of communication to discuss and address most, if not all possible contentious issues, in a non-violent and more constructive nature.
- 7) Legitimacy: This in turn increases the acceptability of governmental actions since people feel that they have been involved in decision-making processes.

- 8) Educational opportunities: This informs the public on municipal affairs, development, policies, and the operations of local government, enhancing citizenship and healthy involvement in the welfare and progression of civil governance.

4 RIGHTS AND DUTIES OF MEMBERS OF THE PUBLIC

4.1 Rights

Members of the public in Nanyuki Municipality have the right to:

- Information: Gather information concerning matters deemed pertinent to subjects under discussion.
- Expression: Participate actively in matters pertaining to their duty and give suggestions on how they can be solved.
- Inclusivity: Take part in a process that is open to ideas and that embraces the variation in opinion and views.
- Feedback: Members of the public should be able to get feedback on how their input affects decisions made.

4.2 Duties

Members of the public also have the duty to:

- Constructive engagement: Avoid personal attacks or intimidating behavior when contributing in the public forum.
- Compliance: Strictly follow the guidelines when it comes to participation and the kind of procedures you are to embark on.
- Respect: Again, respect the rights/feel free to share your opinions with other people involved in the process.
- Community well-being: Have the ability to bank beneficial returns and facilitate contribution towards the improvement of the community at large.

The rights and duties of the citizens, and the municipality are in harmony in creating and sharing meaningful participation.

5 CONDITIONS FOR MEANINGFUL PUBLIC PARTICIPATION

For meaningful public participation in Nanyuki Municipality, key conditions include:

1. Inclusivity: Aim to collect the information from residents working in various organizations or positions, as well as from people of different ages, genders, ethnicity, and backgrounds.

2. Access to information: Ensure that the drivers of change, the matters of concern, the processes of decision-making and considerations of consequences or effects are well explained and understood by all relevant stakeholders.
3. Early engagement: Public involvement should be carried out early in the planning or the process of making a decision to ensure adequate time is provided for the public to make their contribution.
4. Open Communication channels: Maintain clear, two-way communication by use of online forums, emails, and other public platforms for receiving feedback, questions, and concerns.
5. Respect for local knowledge: Local knowledge and experiences give communities a range of skills, which should be integrated into decision-making processes.
6. Capacity building: Provide information and training to the public that will be relevant for sustaining an active engagement.
7. Feedback mechanisms: Incorporate ways of offering participant feedback with transparency and accountability.
8. Accountability: Minimize the public management processes where public input is merely tokenistic and does not result in decisions being changed to reflect the public's opinion as a way of enhancing public trust in the decision-making process.



Therefore, through compliance with these conditions, Nanyuki Municipality is envisaged to enhance a more positive, open and efficient participatory culture in development undertakings.

6 SPECIFIC CONTENT AREAS AND MECHANISMS TO BE USED IN ENGAGING THE PUBLIC

In Nanyuki Municipality, specific content areas for public engagement include:

- 1) Development plans: Asking the public for opinions, proposals, and comments regarding the development strategies for the municipality, infrastructure investment, and urbanization programs.
- 2) Budgeting and finance: Engaging citizens and increasing their involvement in conversations over the distribution and spends, financial choices, among others.
- 3) Environmental policies: About encouraging the community to converse the matter concerning the environment and the conservation of the environment and the sustainable development.
- 4) Social services: Inviting feedback on social services, medical services, educational programs and other services for the community.
- 5) Land use and zoning: Matters concerning land use, zoning and development permit.
- 6) Emergency preparedness: Civic engagement with citizens to understand their willingness to participate in the development and implementation of emergency response plan, disaster preparedness and community protection measures.

Mechanisms for public engagement include:

- 1) Public meetings : To predict people's reactions by holding town hall meetings, forums or public hearings where people are allowed to make their grievances and contributions.
- 2) Surveys and questionnaires: Handing out questionnaires where people fill in some specific questions or views regarding to some aspects of the society.
- 3) Online platforms: To engage different audiences and ensure that people can join events or initiatives virtually.
- 4) Focus groups: When looking for qualitative insight, arranging small group discussions where the general ideas may become particular notions and in-depth discussions can occur.
- 5) Community workshops: Organizing seminars and trainings to pass knowledge to the rest of the population on the said issue and even engage them in the process of finding solutions.

Through these content areas and engagement mechanisms, Nanyuki Municipality thus promotes the involvement of the public and consequently, has more extensive and encompassing approach towards arriving at decisions.

7 GENERAL FRAMEWORK FOR CONTENT AND MECHANISMS OF PUBLIC PARTICIPATION

Designing a framework for public participation in Nanyuki Municipality involves key components:

- **Communication Channels:** Nanyuki Municipality aims at establishing diverse communication channels (e.g., town hall meetings, social media, local radio) to reach a broad audience.
- **Information Dissemination:** The Municipality ensures clear and accessible information about municipal plans and decisions through various media.
- **Community Involvement:** This entails fostering community involvement in decision-making processes through workshops, focus groups, and consultation sessions.
- **Feedback Mechanisms:** The Municipality implements effective feedback mechanisms to gather opinions, suggestions, and concerns from the public.
- **Technology Integration:** Exploring the use of technology (websites, mobile apps) to enhance accessibility and engagement is highly encouraged.
- **Education and Awareness:** The Municipality conducts awareness campaigns to educate residents about their rights, responsibilities, and the importance of participation.
- **Inclusive Representation:** Ensuring representation from diverse demographic groups, considering factors such as age, gender, and socioeconomic status is key in the Municipality.
- **Legal Framework:** Establishing a legal framework outlining the rights and responsibilities of both the municipality and the public in the participation process is vital in the Municipality.
- **Capacity Building:** This entails building the capacity of both municipal staff and the public to actively participate in decision-making.
- **Transparency:** Prioritizing transparency in the decision-making process, providing access to relevant documents and information is highly encouraged within the Municipality.
- **Evaluation and Improvement:** Regularly evaluating the effectiveness of the participation mechanisms and will aid making improvements based on feedback.
- **Conflict Resolution:** Nanyuki Municipality has developed a mechanism for addressing conflicts arising from public participation and aims at facilitating resolution.
- **Documentation:** This aims at maintaining comprehensive records of public input, discussions, and decisions for accountability and future reference.

Adapting these principles to the specific context of Nanyuki Municipality will contribute to a robust framework for public participation.

8 COLLECTION AND ANALYSIS OF INFORMATION FROM THE PUBLIC

This includes designs such as the following:

- 1) **Surveys and Questionnaires** : Design and distribute surveys/questionnaires to gather structured feedback on specific issues, ensuring questions are clear and concise.
- 2) **Town Hall Meetings** : Organize regular town hall meetings to allow direct interaction between municipal officials and the public, providing a platform for open discussions.
- 3) **Focus Group Discussions** : Conduct focused group discussions with representative samples of the population to delve deeper into specific topics and gather qualitative insights.
- 4) **Community Workshops** : Facilitate workshops to educate the public on relevant issues and obtain their input through brainstorming sessions.
- 5) **Online Platforms** : Utilize online platforms, including social media and dedicated websites, to reach a broader audience and collect virtual feedback.
- 6) **Key Informant Interviews** : Conduct interviews with key community leaders, influencers, or experts to gain valuable perspectives.



9 COMMON CHALLENGES IN PUBLIC PARTICIPATION AND SOME PROPOSALS FOR MITIGATION

9.1. Challenges

- i. Limited engagement : It is not easy to involve a large number of people in a project because people may have little interest in, are uninformed, or even suspicious of, the effects of taking part.
- ii. Unequal representation : It can be challenging to close the gap to depict the actual population in terms of composition since some subjects are going to be underrepresented, so the results will be prejudiced.
- iii. Demographic disparities : Mixing and engaging various categories still presents difficulties, including considering age, status and cultural differences.
- iv. Conflicting opinions : Biological differences also have a way of eliciting diversity in opinions and therefore managing conflict may not be easy, which may slow down the decision-making process and in the process widen the gap between the decision-makers.
- v. Transparency issues : Decisions cannot effectively be executed because centralization of decision making power raises issues concerning the transparency of information in decision making.
- vi. Resource constraints : Limited resources, both in terms of time and funding, can hinder efforts to facilitate effective public participation.
- vii. Technological barriers : Technology may be used to support participation and this may be a downside as not everyone has computers or the technical ability to use these kinds of platforms.
- viii. Political influence : The public participation may at times be hindered, due to political influence or intercession, thus compromising the whole process.
- ix. Fear of retaliation : This comes in light to the fact that some people may be advised or forced to withdraw from the poll because of repercussions in case they offer their views.
- x. Ineffective communication : Both, intent and implementation of public participation initiatives can stoke controversy, where stakeholders are differentially informed or uninterested in the purpose, benefits, and outcomes of public participation initiatives.

9.2. Mitigation measures

- i. Proactive Outreach : The Municipality aims at exercising an aggressive campaign to encourage people to participate as a result be empowered through passivation and use of information, education, communication and technology.
- ii. Inclusive Strategies : Making structural changes to involve anybody regardless of demography, geographic location or socio-economic status is key within the Municipality.
- iii. Accessible Platforms : Proper information to reach out participants in easy ways, depending on whether they prefer online or face-to-face means of communication and whether they have easy access to recent technologies or not will be considered in Nanyuki Municipality.

- iv. Facilitation and Mediation : Engaging professional moderators, especially when contentious issues surface within the team will aim at ensuring others maintain courteous and mutually acceptable tones.
- v. Transparent Processes : Improving the level of openness through proper and comprehensive reporting of the processes followed, inclusive of other information, in addition to making every information and document accessible is highly encouraged.
- vi. Capacity Building : The Municipality will ensure that participants are built-up to undertake the task, enabling them understand the matter to be addressed as well as gain the skills to make a positive contribution towards the outcome.
- vii. Resource Allocation : The Municipality will commit adequate time, funding, and human labor to the initiatives aimed at boosting public participation in order to achieve genuine engagement.
- viii. Technology Inclusivity : The Municipality will mitigate the technological issues by offering the means for participation and guarantee that the utilization of technology will not discount people who are not as well-equipped technically.
- ix. Legal Safeguards : The Municipality aims at establishing legal frameworks that protect participants from retaliation, ensuring a safe environment for expressing diverse opinions without fear of repercussions
- x. Continuous Feedback Loop : The Municipality aims at implementing ways and means of constant feedback and reporting, which will enable the participants to be in a position to see the input they are making and the resultant effect of such contributions thus encouraging participants' ownership in the process.

10 THE MUNICIPALITY OF NANYUKI APPROACH TO PRIVATE SECTOR ENGAGEMENT

10.1 Introduction

Welcome to the journey of implementing a Private Sector Engagement Framework in the Municipality of Nanyuki. This framework is designed to strategically harness the strengths of the private sector to drive sustainable development, economic growth, and improved living standards within our community. Specifically, this framework incorporates role and responsibility definition that the Municipality and private sector will assume; accountability and transparency; and measurement of benefits derived from a particular collaboration.

10.2 Principles of engaging the Private Sector

The principles of private sector engagement in the Municipality of Nanyuki are set to align with development goals and include:

- i. Inclusiveness-It involves the incorporation of many private sector participants with attention to the type of enterprises, size of firms, and from which demographic areas.
- ii. Transparency-Makes it easier to share information with the public on the proposed policies, future development, and hardships that affect the municipality.It also gives clear guidance on how and ways through which private sector can engage and contribute.
- iii. Mutual Benefit-Promotes initiatives that result in mutual benefits for both the municipality and the private sector. This is because collaboration should be a win-win, supporting economic growth and community development.
- iv. Long-term profitability- Considers the viability of projects and their potential impact on the municipality in terms of functionality, sustainability, and profitability over the long term.
- v. Innovation-Encourages innovation and creativity in private sector contributions. Municipality of Nanyuki aims at exploring novel approaches and technologies that will address municipal challenges and enhance services.
- vi. Community Influence-Stresses on community specific projects that benefits the community in provisions of employment, development of skills as well as enhanced standard of living among the communities.

- vii. Legal and Ethical Compliance – This ensures that there is basic compliance of legal and ethical standards of policy on a private sector engagement. It also formulates rules of conduct that would help avoid issues of unprofessionalism, conflict of interest, and unethical behavior in Municipality of Nanyuki.
- viii. Adaptability-Recognizes the dynamic nature of the private sector and Municipal of Nanyuki needs. This will foster an environment where the Municipality of Nanyuki and the Private Sector will adapt to changing circumstances and emerging opportunities.
- ix. Risk Management-Establishes frameworks for evaluating and avoiding risks that may arise due to transactions with the private sector. This encompasses risks related to expenditure, project duration, and the overall effects on the society.
- x. Capacity Building-There is a provision to build the capacity of local businesses and entrepreneurs with requisite skills to effectively address and engage in municipal projects.
- xi. Public-Private Collaboration-Fosters alliances between the Municipality of Nanyuki and the private entity businesses. This also studies the possibility of partnering with other organizations, specifically with Governments in the form of Public Private Partnerships (PPPs) wherever possible for consolidating efforts and skills.
- xii. Feedback and Evaluation-Creates feedback processes that would help to critically evaluate different private sector engagements. Thus, while the Municipality of Nanyuki will not directly benefit from the evaluation results, this feedback will be used to review approaches taken and enhance similar projects in the future.
- xiii. Sustainability-Promote social responsibility by urging private sector entities to consider the welfare of the society when selecting projects to invest in, education and environmental sustainability.
- xiv. Flexibility- This involves choosing the option that renders the Municipality of Nanyuki flexible in its operations and willing to change strategies depending on the needs of the municipality and other influential sectors.

These principles will help in fulfilling the objective of framing a framework for the enhancement of Public-Private Sector Partnership, for sustainable development in the Municipality of Nanyuki.

10.3 A proactive approach to Private Sector Engagement

To adopt a proactive approach to private sector engagement in the Municipality of Nanyuki, the following steps have been put into consideration:

- ✓ Stakeholder analysis to identify and understand key private sector participants in Nanyuki. This includes businesses, industry associations, and entrepreneurs.

- ✓ Strategic planning to outline the municipality's goals and objectives for private sector engagement with clearly defined areas, where collaboration will bring about positive impacts.
- ✓ Early consultation to engage with the private sector in the planning stages of municipal projects. This will seek input and feedback to incorporate the private sector's perspectives into decision-making processes.
- ✓ Regular communication channels to keep the private sector informed about upcoming projects, investment opportunities, and municipal plans. This will include newsletters, forums, and workshops.
- ✓ Identify Incentives for private sector involvement, such as tax breaks, streamlined permit processes, or access to resources that can facilitate their participation.
- ✓ Public-Private Partnerships (PPPs) by exploring opportunities for PPPs, where the municipality collaborates with private entities to deliver public services or infrastructure projects. This will enhance efficiency and resource mobilization.
- ✓ Technology Adoption to facilitate communication and collaboration. Utilizing online platforms, databases, and digital tools will streamline information sharing and project management.
- ✓ Capacity building for local businesses to enhance their capabilities. This will include training, mentorship, and access to resources that foster growth.
- ✓ Pilot projects where implementation of small-scale pilot projects in collaboration with the private sector to test innovative solutions and build trust.
- ✓ Proactive Problem Solving by anticipating potential challenges and proactively addressing them. A mechanism for quick resolution of issues raised by the private sector is in place to enhance responsiveness.
- ✓ Community Engagement in discussions about private sector engagement to ensure that projects align with community needs and aspirations, fostering a sense of shared ownership.
- ✓ Adaptive planning to accommodate emerging opportunities and challenges that requires a flexible approach that allows adjustments based on evolving circumstances.
- ✓ Regular monitoring and evaluation to implement a robust system to assess the impact of private sector engagement initiatives. Data and feedback will be used to refine strategies and improve outcomes.
- ✓ Networking and collaboration events where municipal officials, private sector representatives, and other stakeholders can interact, fostering relationship building and idea exchange.

By adopting a proactive approach, the Municipality of Nanyuki aims at creating an environment conducive for effective private sector engagement, driving sustainable development and mutual benefits for the community and businesses.

Designing a private sector engagement framework for Municipality of Nanyuki has involved several key steps:

- i. Assessment to understand the local economic landscape, identifying key industries, businesses, and potential areas for growth.
- ii. Stakeholder mapping to identify key private sector stakeholders in Nanyuki, including businesses, industry associations, and entrepreneurs to understand their perspectives and priorities.
- iii. Defined objectives that clearly articulate the goals and objectives of private sector engagement within Municipality of Nanyuki, aligning them with the municipality's development plans where priority areas in private sector collaboration will bring tangible benefits.
- iv. Legal and regulatory review where evaluation of existing laws and regulations affecting the private sector in Nanyuki have been used to identify potential barriers or areas for improvement.
- v. Proposed changes or reforms to create a more conducive environment for private sector growth.
- vi. Incentive Mechanisms by developing incentive programs or policies to encourage private sector investment and participation in municipal development projects. The Municipality will consider tax incentives, streamlined permit processes, or public-private partnership models.
- vii. Communication and Collaboration to establish a communication strategy to engage with the private sector and foster collaboration. Regular meetings, workshops, or forums shall be facilitated by the Municipality to enhance dialogue and build strong relationships.
- viii. Capacity Building to identify areas where the private sector may require support. The Municipal will develop training programs or initiatives to enhance the skills and capabilities of local businesses.
- ix. Monitoring and evaluation, which will aid assess the impact of private sector engagement and make regular review progress against set objectives and make adjustments as needed.
- x. Sustainability to ensure the sustainability of private sector engagement initiatives by integrating them into long-term municipal development plans. Therefore, the Municipal will explore opportunities for knowledge transfer and skills development within the community.
- xi. Feedback Mechanisms to establish instruments for feedback and continuous improvement, involving both private sector entities and community stakeholders.

Key to note is that specific details of this framework depend on the unique characteristics, challenges, and opportunities present in Municipality of Nanyuki. This in mind, collaboration and adaptability are key elements in successfully implementing a private sector engagement framework.

10.4 Engagement models

The Municipality of Nanyuki considers various engagement models to foster collaboration with the private sector, which include:

1) Public-Private Partnerships (PPPs)

This means developing forms of cooperation in which the municipality is fingered as having the overall responsibility for designing, funding, and executing projects in conjunction with the private sector. This model is effective for large-scale infrastructure development, such as roads, utilities or public facilities..

2) Joint Ventures

The use of developing a partnership model where organizations form joint ventures to undertake particular tasks will mainly entail shared liability and profits contracting and auxiliary risks; this will cover all sectors with a focus on; real estates and service sectors.

3) Service Contract

This model will be on engaging the private sector through service contracts, where a company provides specific services to the municipality.

4) Challenge Competitions

Here, the Municipal will solicit for challenges or competitions which would create incentives for the private sector to innovate an approach in tackling issues that confront the Municipal and award contracts to the most effective solutions.

5) Business Improvement Districts (BIDs)

Through this model, the Municipal is to engage business enterprises in the formation of Business Improvement District in which the businesses pay an agreed amount towards common area enhancement, promotional campaigns and maintenance within a specified region.

6) Community Benefit Agreement

Negotiating agreements with private developers will outline specific benefits for the local community in exchange for development rights. This model will ensure that private projects contribute positively to community welfare.

7) Innovation Hubs and Incubators

The Municipal of Nanyuki will establish innovation hubs or incubators in collaboration with private sector partners to foster entrepreneurship and technological innovation within the municipality.

8) Corporate Social Responsibility (CSR) Initiatives

This encourages private sector entities to participate in CSR initiatives that align with municipal development goals. This can include supporting education, healthcare, or environmental sustainability projects.

9) Vendor Forums

This will entail hosting regular vendor forums to connect with local businesses and inform them about upcoming opportunities, procurement processes, and municipal needs.

10) Community-Driven Development

This will facilitate community-driven development projects in collaboration with private sector partners, ensuring that the community plays an active role in decision-making.

It is therefore important to note that the preferred engagement model for the Municipalities of Nanyuki, will depend on the overall objectives, individual projects and other dynamics. Here, it will be important to stress that adopting an appropriately framed approach that accounts for the context of cooperation between the municipality and the private sector, as well as the strengths and weaknesses of each party, is going to be critical for achieving the desired outcomes.

10.5 Areas of private sector partnerships in the skills development sector.

This paper seeks to establish that partnerships between the private sector and Nanyuki Municipality will extend across various sectors, thus positively impacting on the local economy, Municipal infrastructure and overall community welfare.

Here are potential areas for collaboration:

- Transportation and Communication-Investment in road networks, railway, bridges, telecommunications among other requirements that create linkages and accessibility to resources.
- Real estate and housing development: Engage with the private sector to respond to housing deficits, manage and enhance the construction of housing units, and encourage appropriate urbanism for human habitats.
- Tourism and hospitality: This will require cooperation with private sector. some of the goals include partnering with private organizations in establishment of required hospitality tally, accommodations and tourist attractions in line with the potential offered by Municipality of Nanyuki as a tourist destination.
- Food Security-Agriculture and Agribusiness-Consult with private farmers to foster good practices in agriculture and agro-processing, as well as construct a localized value chain.
- Technology and Innovation-Encourage technology companies to come and partner with the Municipality with regards to the development of the infrastructural technology systems and integration of the smart urban area solutions as well as encouraging innovatively minded individuals to set up their enterprises.
- Waste Management and Environmental Sustainability-Develop partnerships with private firms to assist in the enhancement of waste management, provide solutions to reduce the Municipal's environmental problem, and promote recycling efforts.
- Healthcare Services – specially develop relationships with private health sectors to increase health facilities and extend medical services, and to strengthen health promotion and disease prevention programs.
- Education and Skills Development –Conduct advocacy with private institutions offering education and training in relation to enhancing the availability, quality and quantity of education and skills development training for the residents.

- Retail and Commercial Development-Promote private sector investment in the development of retail, commercial and other related mixed use property that will help revitalize the local economies and promote employment.
- Energy and Utilities- this involves working with private energy providers so as to improve on the existing energy infrastructure in the municipality, promote new energy sources and other developments to do with both reliable and sustainable energy.
- Community Development Initiatives-Engage with Private Sector on community-based development endeavors, cultural heritage, social needs, and other community infrastructural projects.
- The provision of Banking Services-Another way to operate is to cooperate with financial institutions to expand banking services for the population, popularize financial literacy, and financial intermediaries to improve the quality of financial inclusion.
- Transportation and Logistics and Design – There is need for the enhancement of transport through hiring private transport firms and coming up with effective ways of managing logistics and the mobility of people within the municipality.

The above areas of private sector partnership match broad areas of Municipal development in that, they bring together different facets of development in assessing the challenge and vision of the people in the Municipality of Nanyuki to address the aspirations of the community in fulfilling the development goals and priorities of the municipality.

11 CONCLUSION

Overall, the promotion of private sector development in the Municipality of Nanyuki is seen as a promising avenue for development that will not only ensure an improvement in the standards of living of the people but also catalyze economic growth. By doing so, it will take advantage of opportunities available in the sectors represented by private players, and effectively balance growth across all divisions.

The external authorities, resources and new ideas can be accessed by Municipality of Nanyuki to enhance the well-being of the community and thereby bring improvements in the quality of life of people in the region. Such cooperative and efficient relationship will enhance the possibility that private sector engagements operate as per the vision of the municipality and promote the future progress of a sound and resistant society.
